Minutes of the Board of Trustees February 13, 2024 at 5:30 pm

Members present: Kay Cooper, Lyn Smeenk, Shawn Stinton, Sandra Baker, Dennis Simmons, Carol Umenthum, Pastor Chuck Aurand. Members absent: Richard Holdhusen.

Meeting called to order by Kay Opening prayer led by Pastor Chuck

Minutes of the January 10, 2024 meeting were read and reviewed. Motion by Lyn, 2nd by Shawn to approve the minutes as presented. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The Financial Reports were presented by Kay.

Kay gave the new members an overview of the church accounts, the checking account for Budgeted Income and Expenses, the Special Funds accounts, the Money Market account, and the CDs all held at the Pioneer Bank and Trust.

Kay explained that the net loos of \$4785.93 on the January 31, 2024 Income Statement was the result of two items: first, the payment in the amount of \$2074.59 to Albright Construction should have come out of the Capital Improvement account, and not from the Christian Education budget line item. Second the payment to Guide One Insurance in the amount of \$3832.50 for the church insurance reflects a 6- month premium amount. The next payment will be due in mid-July. Motion by Lyn, 2nd by Shawn to approve the Financial Reports as reviewed and explained. Motion approved.

Election of Officer for 2024:

Nominations were entertained: Chairperson-Kay, Vice Chairperson-Shawn, and Secretary-Carol. Motion by Dennis, 2nd by Lyn to close nominations and approve the slate of officers for 2024. Motion approved.

Old Business:

- A. Mischelle Reede's maintenance requests in the basement were reviewed. 1) needs a thermostat cover in the southwest corner room. 2) replacement of the floor tiles between the kitchen and the dining hall. 3) replace the transition strip between the hallway and the kitchen. Carol will ask Keith to check into repair solutions.
- B. Kay listed several items for consideration. 1) the brickwork on the church sign is crumbling, discussed the possibility of replacing the sign with a laser cut steel sign. 2) new pew cushions. 3)the deck surface of the front steps needs attention. 4) the weather stripping at the bottom of the southwest door. 5)the latch sticks on the south middle door and there is a very big step down to the landing outside. 6)check with an arborist to cut down the dead tree out front and replace it, prune the remaining trees in the parkway. 7)need to prioritize the replacement of the emergency shut off valves on the

boiler pipes to the 8 or 10 radiator units. Some of them will not open. Blake may be able to replace them.

New Business:

- A. Delaney Campbell has been retained to fill in when Lanelle is unable to play for worship. Delaney is available until August. She will be a 1099 sub-contracted musician at a rate of \$75.00 per Sunday. Motion ????
- B. Update the signature cards for the Special Funds account, remove Rhonda and add Kathy King. Motion Dennis, 2nd Sandra to remove Rhonda and add Kathy King to the Special Funds account signature card. Motion approved.
- C. Kay read from the Church By-Laws regarding the duties and responsibilities of the Board of Trustees, mainly, to be responsible for the real property of the church and to oversee the financial matters of the church.
- D. Discussed the need to update the By-Laws and to develop Standard Workings Rules. Pastor Chuck stated that the Church Council is studying this issue.

Pastor's Report:

- A. Pastor Chuck is requesting that \$4000.00 of his salary amount be moved from the Minister's Salary line item to the Minister's Housing Allowance line item in the 2024 Budget. The change is recommended as a personal tax saving measure. Motion Shawn, 2nd Lyn to make the change to the 2024 budget line items, deducting \$4000.00 from the Minister's Salary and adding \$4000.00 to the Minister's Housing Allowance. Motion approved.
- B. Pastor Chuck presented his requests for pastoral reimbursements for approval.
 - 1) Office Expenses: Church credit card, \$42.00 and pastor's debit card, \$145.20, totaling \$187.01 for Office Expenses.
 - 2) Professional Expenses: Church credit card, \$36.35 and pastor's reimbursement, \$24.95, totaling \$61.30 for Professional Expenses.
 - 3) Pastor's reimbursements, \$145.20 and \$24.95, totaling \$170.15. Motion Shawn, 2nd Lyn to approve the Pastor's reimbursements of \$170.15. Motion approved.
- C. Pastor Chuck will be taking 2 weeks of vacation February 26 through March 12 to attend his son's wedding. Rev. Gail Arnold will provide pulpit supply March 3 and March 10. The Grief Support Group and the Lenten Bible Study will be covered by Rev. Jean Helmer?

Next Meeting:

By consensus, the Board of Trustees will continue to meet the second Tuesday of the month at 5:30 pm. The next meeting is set for March 12, 2024 at 5:30 pm.

Closing Prayer led by Pastor Chuck. Meeting adjourned at 6:45 pm.

<u>Pulpit/vacation</u>: Pastor Gail Arnold will be filling the pulpit while Pastor Chuck is gone. Colleen will contact Pastor Arnold to remind him and will also get with Belle Fourche Bookkeeping to get check.

<u>Duties: Sign ups/clipboards:</u> Hand out on Church Constitution given out on duties of Diaconate members. Also discussed usher, greeters, cookie hour hosts and sending out post card to remind people. Will table for now and discuss in March.






